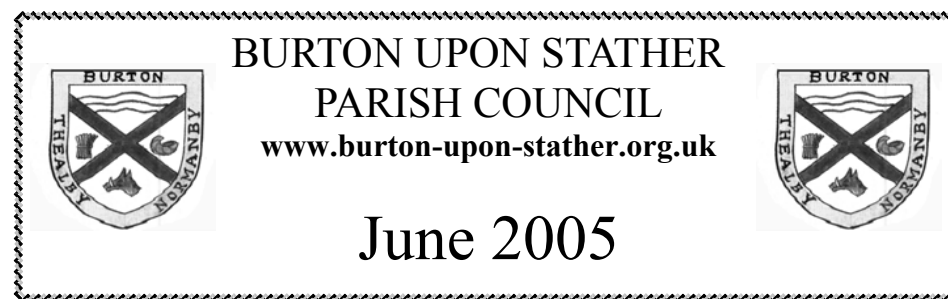

TRAVEL SAVINGS FOR THE OVER 60'S

Did you know you could apply for a concessionary travel pass if you are over 60?
 People with disabilities also qualify for free travel and, if they cannot travel on public transport alone, a companion can take advantage of half fare travel.
 You can use the travel pass on buses throughout North and North East Lincolnshire, Lincoln, Goole, Doncaster and Hull – as long as the journey starts in North Lincolnshire.
 They can also be used on the TransPennine Express and Northern Rail trains as far as Cleethorpes, Lincoln and Doncaster.
 A concessionary pass entitles holders to half price cheap and standard day return tickets and a third off Saver, Supersaver and Standard single tickets.
 You will need to show proof of age and proof of address as users must live in North Lincolnshire.

Burton upon Stather Parish Council Annual Report 2005

Cllr Miles Aykroyd completed his second very successful year as Chairman of the Parish Council and is now Vice Chairman. Councillor Bob Harris of 21 Ashwood Close moves up from Vice Chairman to Chairman.

During 2004 we were sad to lose the services of Councillors Angie Jennison, Simon Arnold, Sarah Hall, Mrs Dorothy Clark and Kevin Gray, but welcomed in their place Mrs Mandy Campbell, Noel Thornes, Mrs Carol Middleton, Mrs Belinda Clark-Vessey and Mrs Pam Cooper from Normanby. A full list of your Parish and North Lincolnshire Councillors can be found on the Post Office noticeboards or on the Parish website at www.burton-upon-stather.org.uk, which is regularly updated by Miles Aykroyd. You can find a wealth of information and photographs on the site, read Minutes of all Parish Council meetings and read about the decisions made.

Our new Neighbourhood Beat Officer is PC Amanda Barnett. If you would like to report any crime, anti social behaviour, speeding etc ring 0845 60 60 222. The call will be logged and PC Barnett will get to know any information regarding her beat. Watch out, too, for the Humberside Police caravan which parks in the Health Centre car park. Their visit is advertised in the Scunthorpe Evening Telegraph and on the Post Office noticeboard.

The Parish Council raises money for use in Burton, Normanby and Thealby by means of the Parish precept which is collected from you by North Lincolnshire Council and given back to the Parish in two instalments. The precept this year is £35,000 and is used to pay for administration by the Part-time Clerk, Pauline Denby, Parish insurances, property maintenance, grounds maintenance and grants for local organisations. An audited financial statement will be distributed to every household with the next newsletter, but you can see the detail of how Council money is spent on the Council Minutes.

The Parish owns the Village Hall, Parish Office, the Playing Fields, Glebe Paddock, the new cemetery, 24 public seats, 6 bus shelters, some streetlights and various items of equipment. We pay for grounds maintenance of Burton Hills and Thealby Play Area, leased from the Normanby Estate, Glebe Paddock, St Andrew's churchyard and additional grasscutting by North Lincolnshire Council of The Avenue.

At the beginning of December the Council considers requests from village organisations for grants which will be released from the following April onwards. In the past the Council gave considerable financial support to the Village Hall, but now the emphasis is on trying to bring the Playing Field facilities up to standard.

The Council has had to budget for the new cemetery and shared car park off Wiltshire Avenue, as St Andrew's churchyard is almost full. A great deal of effort has gone into the new cemetery with volunteers planting and caring for hundreds of hedging plants around the perimeter. The overhead electricity wires will shortly be diverted around the perimeter and we hope that the cemetery will be open in 2006 when the playing field car park has been resurfaced.

Glebe Paddock has developed well over the years as our Village Green and is a lovely setting for the Burton in Bloom Summer Fayre and the Council's Christmas carol singing. Street lighting, public seats, electricity supply and a permanent Christmas tree stand have improved this facility enormously.

Burton is working towards attaining "quality status" and the Clerk and councillors regularly attend training sessions to ensure that all our procedures comply with best practice.

The website, noticeboards and newsletter, published four times a year and edited by Councillor Colin Curtis, play a large part in good communication with parishioners. If you would like to raise any issue with the Parish Council, please write, telephone or email the Clerk, Mrs Pauline Denby. 15 Minutes are set aside at the start of each Council meeting for members of the public to address Council members directly. Full Council meetings are held on the second Monday of the month in the Green Room of the Village Hall. Other meetings, such as Cemetery, Finance or Planning committees, are held at various smaller venues as stated on the Parish noticeboard. The Council held a record number of 38 meetings and all work undertaken by councillors is voluntary. Only the Chairman receives a small allowance to cover the year's expenses – but the Chairman usually attends more meetings than any other councillor.

We are very fortunate in Burton to have a wealth of volunteers running all kinds of village organisations - well over 20 on the village information sheet. We hope this will demonstrate the community spirit in this Parish when we submit an entry for the Village of the Year Competition, where the emphasis is on community rather than attractive settings. We were very pleased to win the Best Kept Village award in the large village category last year and have entered again this year.
